Although we have been fortunate not to have suffered from terrorist attacks, it does not mean that it will not happen in the future. We must all remain watchful and not be complacent...









At the same time, even with the most Comprehensive security measures, we Cannot presume that we are immune.








The resilience of our people will determine whether our nation can overcome a crisis.



People Cannot simply wait for rescue agencies to help them. They must be ready to take Care of their own essential needs. They must also know emergency drills and procedures in order to know what to do especially during the initial stages of any emergency.







We're currently facing the threat of toxic chemicals...

... instead of sending students home, which can cause confusion and panic and may also be too late, all students and staff are to take shelter in the designated Classrooms.






Until the school principal announces over the PA system to terminate the In-Place Protection.
