
Safety Tips for Household Consumers using LPG

DOs



Ensure that the burner is lit up first.
The user should only place the cookware on the burner of the stove after the burner is lit up.



Open all windows to ventilate the area.



Purchase your LPG accessories with SAFETY Mark only from authorised dealers



To report on suspected LPG leakages or LPG fires, call the SCDF at 995.

DON'Ts



Avoid turning on the gas stove when there is suspected leak (such as the presence of a heavy odour).



Never leave cooking unattended or place combustible items near the open flames.



Maximum 2 LPG cylinders per household

Do not store more than two cylinders in your home at any time. Cylinders should be kept upright in a ventilated cabinet.



CONDUCT REGULAR CHECKS FOR A SAFE HOME

Your LPG dealer should conduct a 5-point check on your LPG system each time a new cylinder is delivered and reinstalled. Otherwise, please contact your dealer to do so.

5-Point Visual Safety Check

Ensure your LPG dealers conduct systematic and comprehensive visual inspection of your LPG system. The 5-Point Visual Safety Check should include:



REGULATOR

· Examine if worn out or expired.



RUBBER HOSE

- Examine if worn out and to replace immediately if damaged.
- Replace with a new set based on the expiry date stated on the hose.



CYLINDER

 Always keep gas cylinders upright and never store them horizontally. Check each cylinder for wear and tear.



HOSE CLIPS

 Ensure that hose clips are neither loose nor too tightly fitted (which may cause an indent and cut on the rubber hose).



LEAK TEST / JOINT CONNECTIONS

- Examine all joint connections between stove and LPG cylinder for wear and tear.
- There is a leakage if bubbles appear when detergent or soap solution is applied on them.



Check for the LPG Safety Tag on your LPG cylinder

- The LPG Safety Tag is a checklist for the dealers in carrying out LPG Home Safety Checks.
- The dealer must mark his company's stamp onto the safety tag to certify the safety check and to ensure that the tag/checklist is affixed to the cylinder.
